

Hallie Morse Daggett
December 19, 1878 – October 19, 1964

Hallie was the first woman hired as a fire lookout by the United States Forest Service. She worked at Eddy's Gulch Lookout on top of Klamath peak for the Klamath National Forest. Her service began in the summer of 1913. The Eddy Gulch Lookout stood on an isolated mountain at an elevation of 6,444 feet above sea level. Access to the look was steep trail that took 3 hours to complete. She worked alone at the lookout for 15 summers. The cabin she occupied at the time of her passing was relocated to the City of Etna park and was dedicated on July 12, 2016.
